WORK TO RESULT IN OVERNIGHT CLOSURES OF MD 43 RAMPS AT I-95

BALTIMORE, MD -- Weather permitting, Sunday, Aug. 1 through Thursday, Aug. 4, from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning, the ramp from **westbound MD 43 (White Marsh Boulevard) to southbound Interstate 95** and the right lane of southbound I-95 in the area of MD 43 (Exit 67) will be temporarily closed to traffic.

The **detour route** will direct motorists to a u-turn at Honeygo Boulevard, to eastbound MD 43, to southbound I-95.

In addition, **Sunday, Aug. 7 through Thursday, Aug. 11,** from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning, the ramp from **eastbound MD 43 to northbound I-95** and the right lane of northbound I-95 in the area of MD 43 (Exit 67) will be temporarily closed to traffic.

The **detour route** will direct motorists to eastbound MD 7 (Philadelphia Road), to westbound MD 43, to northbound I-95.

Closures are for crews to perform work on White Marsh Boulevard bridge as part of the I-95 Express Toll LanesSM (ETLsSM) Project.

Additional lane closures may be in effect on I-95, I-895 and I-695 in the project area from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. the following morning Monday through Thursday. Traffic drags may take place periodically for crews to move equipment.
